At the start of the term, we were treated to an exciting visit from Iron Age Matt. The children were inspired by everything they learned. During the day, we became warriors and took part in warrior training, practising moves and drills. We also found out about the different roles people had in Iron Age society and explored the types of fabrics and animal skins they would have used for their clothing and everyday life.




In DT, we have been learning how to strengthen and reinforce materials. The children designed and made their own boxes to display a special stone. 




Year 3

We thought about the kinds of materials and colours Iron Age people might have used and tried to show this in our weaving.

In science, we have been exploring rocks. First, we discovered different types of rocks. Then we tested them to see what they had in common by investigating their hardness, permeability and how they react to acid. After that, we made our own chocolate and sweet "rocks" to help us understand how sedimentary, igneous and metamorphic rocks are formed. We did also enjoy eating them!








Geography

In geography, we have been looking at renewable sources of energy and where would be best to install either wind turbines or solar panels within our school grounds. We learnt how to use a map key and used this to draw our own maps of the school to add to the presentations of our findings. Lots of us thought the field would be best for wind turbines and the roof of the Year 5 area would be best for solar panels.




Year 4



Science

In science this term, we have looked at electricity, including making circuits and our own switches. We then looked at forces and magnets, looking at what materials are magnetic and conducting an experiment looking at different strengths of magnets. Finally, we looked at light. We used UV beads to look at the power of UV rays from the sun and also looked at how shadows are created.





Art




Design Technology


We began the term with our residential trip to Avon Tyrrell. Braving the elements (including a deluge of rain!), we tired our hand at a range of activities including pioneering, mountain biking, kayaking and raft building. We formed bonds with our new classmates, learned the value of teamwork and had a fantastic time.



Later in the half-term, we thoroughly enjoyed our history lessons in which we thought carefully about whether we can learn anything about societies' values from the structures they built and of their societies. We learned about the Ancient Egyptians, Stone Age Britain and the struggle for power between the Anglo Saxons and the Vikings. The history unit culminated in our Egyptian Day where the children got to show off their Ancient Egyptian costumes and partake in the mummification of an orange, writing in hieroglyphics, created portraits of our teachers in the style of the day and even explored an Egyptian tomb!




Year 5



In our computing lessons, we have been learning how to make vector drawings using the shape and line tools on Microsoft PowerPoint. We learned how to layer shapes on top of each other to create images, as well as how to copy, paste and group shapes to use the software more efficiently.



Our unit of work culminated in the creation of Christmas cards where we learned how to create vector drawings on top of background images.





In art, we have learned about the artwork of Joseph Cornell and his “shadowboxes” filled with objects that tell a story or have emotional resonance. We have practised our sketching skills with a focus on line, shape and tone as well as sculpting objects from clay.

Year 5

In science, we learned about electricity. We revised our knowledge of simple circuits by building and testing circuits using different components before learning the difference between current and voltage. We then got the chance to apply our knowledge and skills to construct “scribblebots.”



In DT, we learned how to join materials together using braces, flanges and slotting. We then applied these skills to creating prototypes for a playground shelter.



Year 6



During our maths sessions, we have been developing our 3D shape knowledge by playing 'guess the shape' games based on mathematical criteria.



In our English lessons, we have been exploring the text 'The Island at the End of Everything'. Through drama, we explored how the author has used vocabulary to show how the different characters were feeling when the news was delivered that changes would be happening to their island. We also have been exploring the active and passive voice.



This term we have been looking at the term 'interpretation' and what interpretation means in the birth narrative.



Within our science lessons, we have been exploring the human body's circulatory system.


Year 6

On Friday 12th December. We took part in our annual Santa Fun Run. It was wonderful to see so many participating and getting into the Christmas spirit.




The football team and running club are back up and running, with both clubs training and competing. I know the children are very grateful to the adults who give up their time to run these. Netball club will be starting in the New Year.




