Year 3 have been working towards answering our big question: "Does anything positive come from conflict?"





I loved re-enacting the sinking of the Mary Rose! It was great fun!









Finally, we had a look around some of the super artwork in the gallery.








We used red and blue card to represent the journey of the blood through the lungs and heart.
